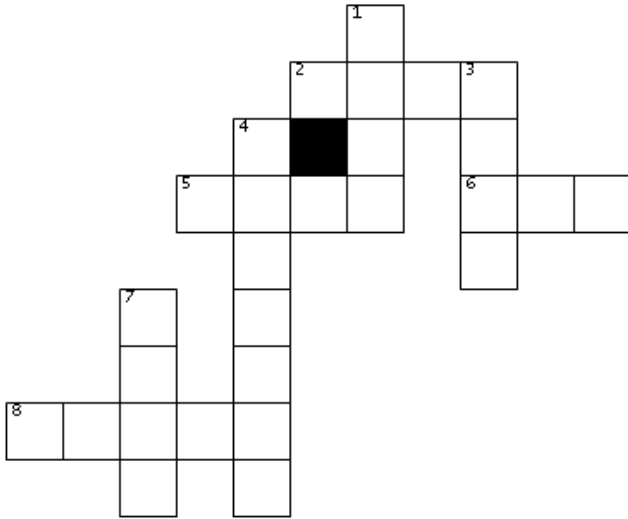
## Break-out Box Clue 2
